

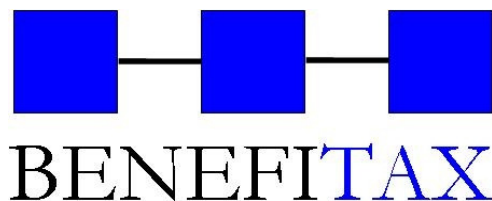

## Why engage in Germany?

**Germany** is the third largest economy in the world and the largest in Europe. The gross domestic product (GDP) amounted to about 2.3 billion Euro in 2006 which was 28% of the GDP of all countries of the Euro area. Forecasts for GDP growth are high for the next years and the unemployment rate is decreasing.

**Germany** is located in the middle of Europe. It has a common border with nine other European countries. Due to a well elaborated infrastructure passenger transportation and merchandise traffic is easily possible inside Germany and cross-border.

**Germany** is the world's foremost location of international trade fairs. About two thirds of all leading international trade fairs take place in Germany. German trade fairs are international: more than half of the exhibitors a high rate of visitors arrive from abroad.
